# Resume and CV Resource Guide

## How resumes and CVs differ:

### Resume

- ✓ Short and concise (1-2 pages)
- ✓ Relevant information; customized
- ✓ Often used for industry jobs
- ✓ Bullet points, not sentences
- ✓ Objective/Summary/Profile

#### CV

- ✓ Longer (often 4+ pages)
- ✓ All training, background, experience
- ✓ Often used for academic positions
- ✓ Short paragraphs about projects
- ✓ Can provide references

### How resumes and CVs are similar:

- → Make good use of white space and have at least 1" margins
- → Use 11-12 point font. Sans serif is easier on the eye
- → Quantify achievements, if possible
- → Use bold font to draw attention to section headers
- → Use the S.T.A.R. Method to describe your experience: Situation, Task, Action, **Result**
- → Start phrases, bullet points, and sentences with action verbs Be consistent with your verb tense
- → Identify and display transferable skills as related to the job posting
- → Check with spelling and grammar
- → Use a single professional email address
- → Add LinkedIn or professional website URL if desired

# **Recommended Sections**

Identifying information - How do you want to be contacted?

Professional Summary or Objective - Most commonly found on resumes

Education - Include degree-granting institutions only

Awards and Honors - Include funding awards and recognition of excellence

Experience - List only relevant experiences in a resume, keep a master list separately

Break this section into subsections to improve organization and readability Leadership/Service - Name only relevant experience in a resume
